We use doing to

if we are referring to future plans, something we are planning or have decided to do in the future. In such circumstances, we have planned something and are almost certain it will be done.

I'm going to buy a computer next month.

if we know that something is likely to happen in the future because there is something in the present (i.e. an indication) which points in that direction. Hurry up! We're going to miss the bus!

C Present continuous

We use the present continuous

> to refer to something we have already decided to do in the immediate/near future.

When we use the present continuous, we wish to emphasize that we are absolutely sure that the act we are referring to is going to happen.

I am leaving for Spain tomorrow.

Compare the sentences:

I'll travel to London one day. (There is a possibility but it is not certain that such a thing is going go happen in the future).

I'm going to travel to London next month. (I have planned it. I intend to do it and I am almost certain it will happen).

I'm leaving for London tomorrow. (I have bought a ticket and I am ready to leave. I am absolutely certain it will happen).
